

The Holy Fathers of the 7th Ecumenical Council

The Seventh Ecumenical Council was held in 787 at Nicaea during the reign of the devout Empress Irene and her son, Constantine, in the time of Patriarch Tarasius. This Council finally confirmed the veneration of icons, justifying it by Holy Scripture, by the witness of the Holy Fathers, and by the undeniable example of miracles manifested through the holy icons.

Adding to examples of miracles previously cited, Bishop Constantine of Cyprus recounted this: One day, a certain shepherd from the town of Constantia drove his flock to pasture, and there saw an icon of the Most-holy Theotokos, all decorated with flowers by the faithful. “Why render so much honor to a rock?” said the shepherd, who had obviously been brought up in iconoclasm. He struck the icon with his iron shepherd’s cane, and damaged the right eye of the image of the Mother of God. As soon as he turned away, he stumbled over that same cane and gouged out his own right eye. Thus injured, he returned to the city, crying out tearfully that the punishment of the Theotokos had befallen him. This Council also decreed that the holy relics of a martyr be placed, without fail, in the Antimension.

Three hundred and sixty-seven Fathers participated in this Council. May the Lord also have mercy on us and save us by their prayers!



The Fall of Humankind. The craftiness of the serpent consists in twisting the words of God’s commandment: “Did God say, ‘You shall not eat from any tree in the garden?’” (*Gn* 3:1, see *Gn* 2:16-17). The insidious question of the serpent draws Eve into a dialogue with him, which gives birth to doubt within her about the truthfulness of God. The evil one takes this doubt within her in order to deceive: “You will not die...you will be like God knowing good and evil” (*Gn* 3: 4-5). The deceit of the Evil One is based on the premise that God is deceiving humankind with his commandment, thereby undercutting their freedom, and that by eating from the tree of good and evil, they will become like God. Some polls indicate that the public is receptive to the general concept of assisted suicide. But the same polls show that people’s views shift when they learn about its dangers - especially for those who are poor, elderly, disabled, or without access to good medical care. Consider that, in Oregon and California, some patients health insurance offered to pay for assisted suicide, but not treatment. And in states where assisted suicide is legal, often no psychiatric evaluation or treatment is required. Additionally, assisted suicide fosters discrimination by creating two classes of people: those whose suicides we spend hundreds of millions of dollars each year to prevent and those whose suicides we assist and treat as a positive good.
